Your experience, our qualifications

Discover how to transform your skills and experience into a formal qualification

At our Centre for Assessment of Prior Learning (CAPL), you can have your industry experience assessed by facilitators then translated into credits towards part or all of an Ara qualification. A major advantage of the CAPL process is that you don't need to give up work, income or time to attend classes to gain knowledge and skills you already possess. It's also flexible and can be arranged around your other commitments.

As part of the CAPL process, you'll need to identify, describe and demonstrate the knowledge and skills you've gained through your work. Our assessors will also take into account any qualifications you already have and courses you've done, and they'll identify any gaps you may have in the knowledge and skills needed to complete your chosen qualification.

They will then design an individualised pathway to enable you to achieve the qualification within the one year time limit.

The cost to gain a full qualification through CAPL depends on the amount of assessment required, but it's always less than the cost of enrolling to study for the qualification.

Steps to achieve a certificate or diploma through CAPL

Connect

Connect with the CAPL office. Either email capl@ara.ac.nz with any queries or fill out the enquiry form at ara.ac.nz/capl

Initial hui/ meeting & application evaluation

The initial hui/meeting will take place during normal working hours at an Ara campus (preferred) or by phone or video conferencing. You'll need to ensure you have at least one hour available.

At this meeting your application will be considered in detail. You'll be advised of the assessment pathway and what we need you to do to proceed. Following the meeting, we'll contact you to discuss your individual journey.

Enrol into CAPL

To proceed, you need to complete and return to CAPL:

- · your signed service agreement
- · your completed enrolment form
- · any other material requested.

Assessment

You'll be contacted by your assessor to begin the assessment process. Your assessor will discuss with you the evidence you need to provide and work out with you a schedule of assessments or milestones you need to achieve.

Decision & notification of outcome

Verbal feedback will be given during your assessment/s. If you fail part of the assessment or assessments we'll tell you what you have to do to complete your qualification, and what this will cost.

No results will be notified until your CAPL fees are paid in full. An appeals process is available through the Appeals Procedure, if required.

How to apply

To apply:

- after referring to the Ara website or subject brochure, select the qualification (and specialisation option if applicable) that you're interested in
- or
- fill in the enquiry form on the CAPL page on the Ara website (ara.ac.nz/capl)

Application criteria

This process is available to anyone who can provide evidence that their learning and experience is at the required level for their chosen qualification. The most important factor about your learning is that it must be current and reflect accepted practice in your industry. To be current, you need to have three to five years' experience and have been working in industry within the past five years.

You may have gained your knowledge and learning from different sources including:

- · formal learning
- · work experience
- · life experience, including voluntary work
- · workplace training courses or workshops

If English is not your first language you will need to provide evidence that you meet the same language requirements as students enrolling in your chosen qualification at Ara.

CAPL support

We will:

- provide guidance on written and pictorial evidence required for your portfolio, and what the assessor will expect from you
- provide templates against which you can summarise your evidence, as part of your portfolio
- explain academic requirements
- oversee the whole process
- act as a go-between if you have issues with your assessment/s or assessor.

Initial hui/meeting

You'll go through an initial meeting with an assessor to:

- discuss your prior learning and experience in relation to the qualification requirements (current, extensive enough, appropriate)
- answer any questions you may have regarding the process, especially around evidence required
- clarify any questions we may have regarding your application
- consider the most appropriate assessment pathway.

This meeting may take place in person (preferred), by phone or by video conferencing.

We'll contact you following this meeting to discuss your individual study plan.

Assessment

Your assessment may include any or all of the following:

- Portfolio a folder of physical evidence of your experience and knowledge (this will be discussed at the initial hui/meeting, but it should include work photos, awards, your application documents, CV, job description, references and any other relevant documents).
- Attestation an employer, whānau or referee attests in writing to your experience and knowledge (we must be able to phone the attester to verify this evidence).
- · Practical assessment
- · Assignment/challenge test

Cost

The cost will depend on the amount of time required for support and assessment.

There are two ways to pay:

Payment in one sum – you will be sent an invoice once you have begun your assessment.

Payment by instalment – in equal amounts paid over a period of up to nine months. This method is conditional on completion of an Arainstalment agreement provided to you by the CAPL office and a credit check conducted and approved by Ara. No results will be released until all fees are received.

You may be eligible for a student loan through Studylink (studylink.govt.nz).

Graduate profile

A graduate profile describes what a learner will know and the skills and attributes they will have on successful completion of the qualification.

To gain a certificate or diploma based on the learning you've gained from work and personal experience, you will be assessed against the graduate profile at Level 4, 5 or 6.

New Zealand Qualifications Framework

The New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) has developed the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) to describe graduates of certificates and diplomas as follows.
